



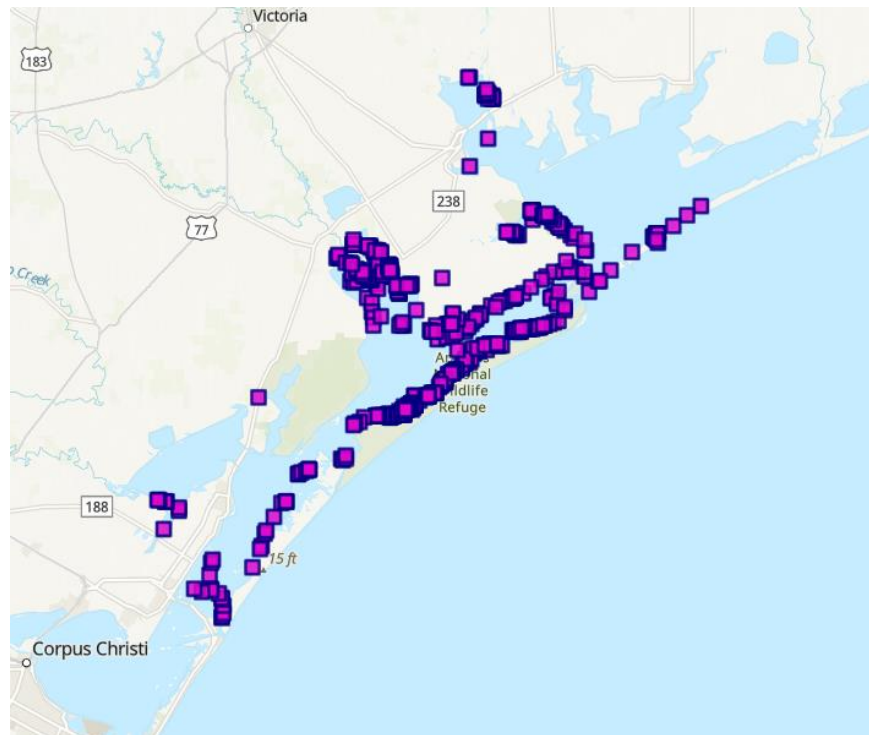
February 2025 Abandoned Crab Trap Removal Program

Status as of March 15, 2025

February 2025 - Implementation!

The closure period was Friday Feb 21 through Sun March 2, 2025

A cold front delayed the start Friday and Saturday, but crews began going out on Sunday Feb 23 continued through Friday Feb 28 when the search was completed. The map below indicates the locations of the traps removed per the Field Maps app.

The increase from last year appears to be the result of a more comprehensive search in Matagorda Bay—both Aransas Bay and San Antonio Bay declined from last year.

The Field Maps data is being QC'd. A comprehensive analysis will be made to extract learnings and comparisons to previous years.

Overall, the program went very well. Despite the bad weather start, participation was excellent with representation from CCA chapters, GBRA, LNRA, Houston and Dallas Zoos, and the public. The search appears to be the most comprehensive yet.
